


IPFW, INDIANA TECH, AND GENESIS OUTREACH JOIN HANDS TO FIGHT HOMELESSNESS

On Saturday, April 16, 2016 students from IPFW and Indiana Tech joined hands to help renovate a home to house a local homeless family. It was nearly two weeks before, that a young mother - who had recently loss her job - along with her daughter entered the doors of Genesis Outreach, Inc. seeking assistance. She had previously been "couch surfing" (staying overnight with relatives and friends) at the time, but desperately longed to find affordable, stable housing of her own and regain control of her life. The homeless mother had been referred to Genesis Outreach by a family friend who was being served

through our permanent supportive housing program, Promising Partnerships.



supportive services, and except for support services, would not remain housed. Program participants become self-sufficient while gaining stability, economic empowerment, and enhanced community development and neighborhood impact. Success is measured by increasing income and maintaining housing for 12 months without experiencing future episodes of homelessness.

THE CURT W. FUHS TRUST

On behalf of the Board of Directors, staff, and residents of Genesis Outreach, Inc., I would like to thank the family of Curt W. Fuhs for a recent contribution of \$20,000. Funds were provided for operational and programmatic support of the Grace Haven emergency shelter, Genesis House transitional shelter, and Promising Partnerships permanent supportive housing programs. Born in Fort Wayne, on December 27, 1930, Curt W. Fuhs served in the US Marine Corp. He worked as a buyer at Magnavox (where he sang as a baritone in the company chorus), then as a manager of Hobson Road Laundry, and he retired as owner of Mr. Curt's Lawn Service. He was a member of St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church for most of his life. A lifelong bachelor, he lived simply, saving most of what he earned to create a substantial charitable trust. Mr. Fuhs passed away on August 27, 2012, but his memory and spirit lives on in the work that his family continues to do in his honor throughout the community. A TRIP TO THE CIRCUS!




Genesis Outreach, Inc. was awarded a grant from St. Joseph Community Health Foundation

THE DOORS OF GENESIS ARE BEING OPENED

In an effort to alleviate access limitations by persons who require the use of wheelchairs, Genesis Outreach, Inc. is making accessibility improvements at its administrative office building located at 2605 Gay Street, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46803. Since our founding in 1988, Genesis Outreach, Inc. has provided affordable housing assistance, supportive services, and case management to residents of northeast Indiana. Over the years, as housing needs have increased and local homelessness has risen, more individuals and families who are physically and/or mentally disabled have applied to our programs or sought emergency assistance. This has brought a heightened awareness by the Board of Directors and organizational leadership for the need to ensure that ALL persons have equal access to the administrative building where the housing services office is located and applications are submitted.



A local contractor, Wen Way Construction, partnered with Genesis Outreach, Inc. to install the ramp and widen the entry door at a reduced cost. Additional lighting improvements and signage are being made throughout July to provide added safety and security to those accessing the building during early morning or evening hours. Funding for the project has been provided by the AWS Foundation through its Mighty Money Grant program. Thank you to all who have participated in this much needed renovation and enhancement of services for the disabled community of northeast Indiana.

LOCAL CHURCHES LEND A HELPING HAND

As with life, rainy days come and go. However, when you are a low-income family struggling to do all you can to make ends meet, rainy days can seem like torrential floods. Recently, several families being served by Genesis Outreach, Inc. simultaneously experienced severe housing challenges and personal crises that were seemingly insurmountable. Homelessness seemed imminent with no immediate resolve in sight. That is, until a few local ministries partnered with Genesis Outreach, Inc. to ensure that the families remained in place and their emergent needs were fully met. With combined donations of nearly \$4,000, we were able to provide affordable housing assistance, essential supportive services, and basic needs supplies to all of the families in need, bringing them to immediate stabilization and allowing them to continue upward mobility towards self-sufficiency. Special thanks to Abundant Life Church, Greater Christ Temple Church, and Rescue Ministries for your generosity, servant-leadership, and benevolence!

Likewise, Pathway Community Church, made a \$10,000 donation to the Promising Partnerships program to ensure its ongoing contribution in ending community homelessness. Promising Partnerships provides permanent supportive housing for approximately 220 homeless individuals in Allen County whom, except for housing, would not receive supportive services, and except for support services, would not remain housed. Through this project, persons in need of long-term housing become self-sufficient while gaining stability, economic empowerment, and enhanced community development and neighborhood impact. It's truly because of partners such as these that Genesis Outreach, Inc. continues to exist! Thank you kindly and may God bless you always.
